

Jean – Yves Duclos

Jean-Yves Duclos obtained a B.A. at the University of Alberta in 1988 (First Class Honours, Economics) as well as an M. Sc. and a Ph.D. in Economics at the London School of Economics respectively in 1989 and in 1992. He is Professor of Economics at Université Laval since 1993 as well as Director of CIRPÉE (Centre Interuniversitaire sur le Risque, les Politiques Économiques et l'Emploi) and network leader of the Poverty and Economic Policy (PEP) international research network. He has also been visiting professor at the University of New South Wales in Australia and at the Institut d'Anàlisi Econòmica at the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona in Spain.

His areas of research are in Public Economics, Econometrics, Welfare Economics, Development Economics and Labour Economics. He has published papers in various journals, among which in *The Canadian Journal of Economics*, *Econometrica*, *Economica*, *Journal of Development Economics*, *Journal of Public Economic Theory*, *Review of Income and Wealth*, and *Journal of Public Economics*. He is currently President of the *Société canadienne de science économique*, associate editor of *Journal of Economic Inequality*, member of the Editorial Board of the *Review of Income and Wealth*, and member of the Council of the Society for the Study of Economic Inequality.
