Food Banks	The purpose of these units is waste reduction. Donated food are accepted, selected, packed and distributed for free to aid organizations, associated to nutritional education. Fairs and Markets	The main objective is to boost Family Agriculture of rural, urban, periurban, agrarian reform settlements, quilombolas, indigenous peoples and beneficiary families of Bolsa Familia Programme. Community Food Production using agro-ecologic technologies.

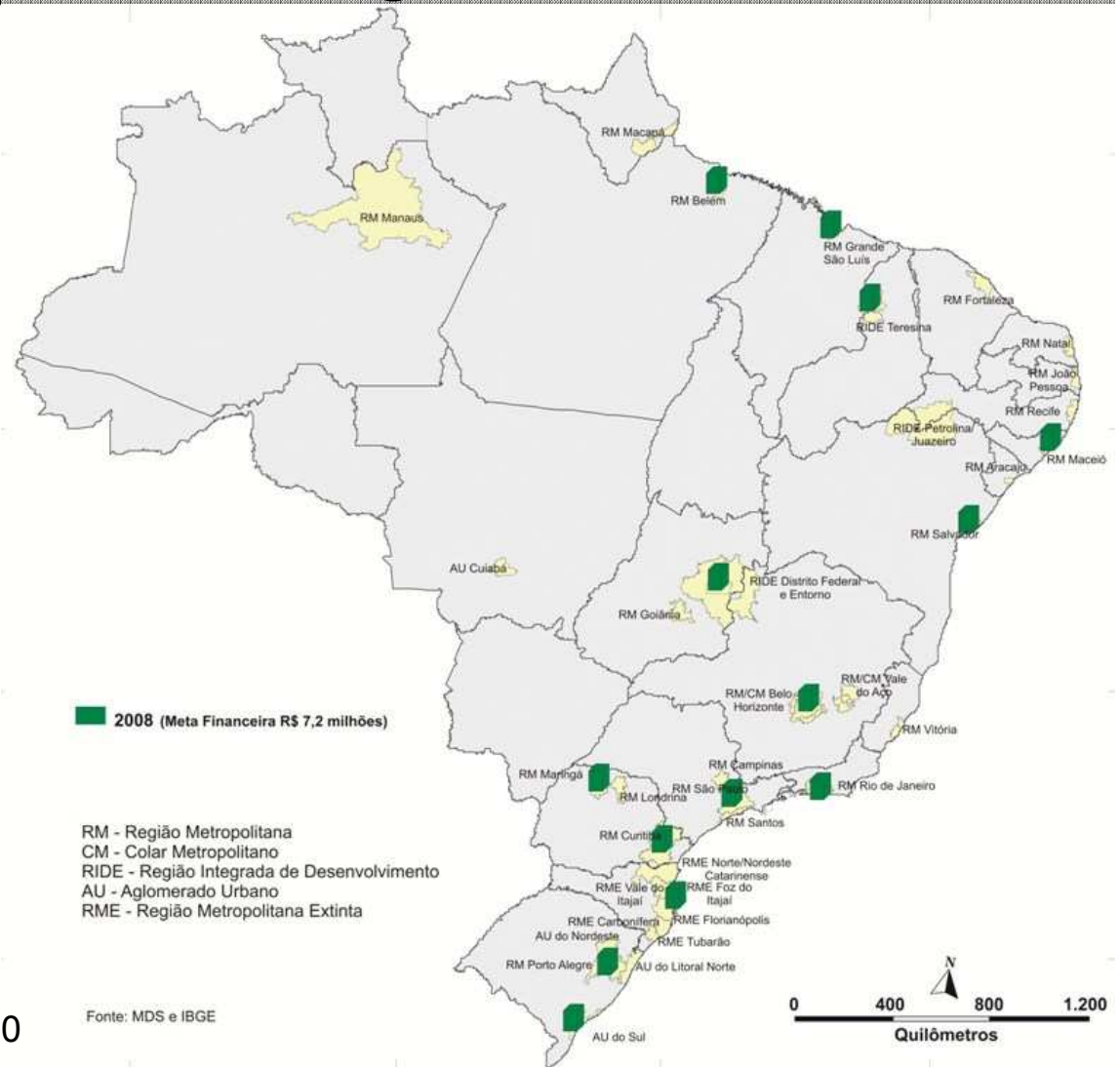
Community mobilization, with special support from the local mayor's office, creates vegetable gardens, plantations, plant nurseries, orchards, medicinal plant gardens, small animal farming, units for food and agricultural products processing/improvement; fairs and public markets for the poor.

Food for self consumption, community restaurant supply, community kitchens, and the surplus is sold at local markets.
