Co-author Giovanni Ferro Luzzi graduated from University of Geneva, where he also completed his PhD in economics in 1996, after obtaining a Master in economics at the University of Manchester. He now holds a position of IRIS-fund Assistant-Professor at the University of Geneva. His main area of research interests is labour economics, earnings distribution analysis, and generally applied microeconomics.

His most recent publications were on the efficiency of the Swiss public employment service, the value of statistical life in Switzerland, and on public/private sector wage differentials. He also works as a consultant for the ILO and the OECD. He helped draft a report on the social impact of globalization for the former, and recently wrote two reports on the employability of older workers in Switzerland and Italy for the latter.
