Sanjay G. Reddy is an Assistant Professor of Economics at Barnard College, Columbia University and has just completed a year as a Laurance S. Rockefeller Visiting Fellow at the Center for Human Values at Princeton University. His areas of work include development economics, international economics and economics and philosophy. He possesses a Ph.D. in Economics from Harvard University, an M.Phil. in Social Anthropology from the University of Cambridge, and an A.B. in Applied Mathematics with physics from Harvard University. He is a former fellow of the Center for Ethics and the Professions and of the Center for Population and Development Studies at Harvard. He has also worked extensively as a consultant for development agencies and international institutions, including the ILO, Oxfam, UNICEF, UNDP, UNU-WIDER, UNRISD and the World Bank. He has been a member of the advisory panel of eminent experts of the UN's Human Development Report, and is presently a member of the UN Statistics Division's Steering Committee on Poverty Statistics. He has published widely, and is a member of the editorial advisory boards of Development, Ethics and International Affairs, and the European Journal of Development Research.
