The Global Labour University invites trade unionists and labour activists to apply to a Masters in "Social Economics and Labour " at the University of the Campinas in São Paulo, Brazil. Using a comparative perspective between advanced and developing countries, this course will focus on economics development, inequality, poverty, strategies of trade unionism and multinational corporations and labour.

The Global Labour University (GLU) is a network of universities, international and national trade unions, civil society organisations and the International Labour Organization (ILO) to provide postgraduate qualification programmes for trade unionists, labour activists, and experts. Interested trade unionists should apply now. The deadline for submission is 1st of September 2010. The courses are taught in English.
